What a delightful first half of the Trinity term we have had. So much learning has happened, and we have had great successes with 100% achievement in both our Phonics assessments in Year 1 and our mock SATS assessments in Year 2. Well done, everyone!

Wrapping up their learning journey this half term with *Marvellous Me* and the *Colour themes*, Crèche and Toddlers have had lots of fun. They did lots of artwork with their feet and shoes, finger exercises with droppers, scooping pompoms, and solving sticky situations, by removing sticky tape - not an easy feat, but a fun thing to do in the end. They tried out aiming at bottles with a ball to see how many they could knock down. **BOOOOWWWWLING!**

Playgroup had their maths classes outdoor to explore nature and enhance their counting skills. They had a wonderful time using leaves, sticks, and other natural materials to count and give quantities. They learnt that a group of things changes when something is added or taken away. This week, the **Nursery** children went on a number hunt and quantified their findings with written numerals to celebrate *National Math Day*. How many hoops can you catch with one hand? Folabiyi caught 4!







Reception has had a busy week learning about numbers from 10 to 20. To celebrate *Numeracy Day*, they went for a double-digit hunt outside. They solved doubling problems as a class. In English, the focus was on how they could be superheroes too. They labelled their own characteristics and what makes each of them a superhero.

Year 1 wrapped up their narrative writing this week, completing the final draft of their version of the *Traction Man* story. They used powerful adjectives and made ambitious choices for their sentences. In maths, pupils explored fractions. The focus was on finding half of an object and an amount. The highlight of the week was the *Hopscotch* game played outdoors to reinforce whole and half numbers and to celebrate *Outdoor Learning Day*.







Years 2/3 had a fun week of learning about the inventions of the telegram and the telephone. They built their own phones and had an exciting time communicating within the classroom. They learned how to measure temperature, body and weather, by reading thermometers. They also learned about biographies and wrote their own on *Hogarth* from *The Iron Man*. *Numeracy Day* was a blast with lots of fun outdoor activities spanning fractions, statistics, and measuring angles.







Years 4 & 5 had an exploratory outdoor learning experience, surveying the playground to generate data for their bar charts and going on an *Angle hunt* to identify different angles in a building. Writing a newspaper report about the failure of *Karl*, the apprentice from their novel *Clockwork*, was a great success. They learned how to exercise an assured and conscious control over levels of formality using manipulation of grammar and vocabulary to achieve this.
